Palatial Cabanas

LOCAL DESIGNERS CREATE LUXURIOUS POOL HOUSES FOR EVERY TASTE



Aqueous Illusion

Resting high on a hillside, this pool offers a few illusions to on-lookers. For those seated around the bluestone terrace, the pool appears to meet the line of the horizon while black tiles at the base of the cabana give the appearance that water flows right under the structure. This pool was designed primarily to allow the owners to enjoy the views from their hillside property, and what better way to enjoy the sunset than from the edge of an infinity pool.

English Countryside

The house beckons the feel of an English manor home by utilizing natural materials such as brick, stone and timber. The multi-terraced rear façade and cabana are complementary to the house and perfect for entertaining. There is a fireplace in the cabana for cooking and warmth in the cooler months; this way, outdoor entertaining can be extended beyond the summertime. Made from colored concrete with flagstone banding, the terrace perfectly accompanies the cabana, which features timbered framing and is capped by an elegant dovecote—a design element used in rural European estates since the 17th century.



French Fantasy

This cabana with stucco and slate roofing has an air of French style. It was designed to fit in with the architecture of the main house and to serve as the link between the house and the grounds. The waterfall beside the cabana was built to look like the natural water source for the oblong pool; it also conceals the opening to a grotto and bar.



Stately Swimming

Looking down on this pool your eye is drawn to the sparkling water, its limestone coping and the terrace of cut bluestone below. Ultimately your attention is captured by the simplicity of the stucco pool house and the symmetry of its three arches. As a result, there is a sense of order and refinement to the grounds as well as the out buildings that's befitting of the stately home.



Family Friendly

This pool and cabana are an extension of the home. Soft colors are mixed with a variety of interesting textures that work well for the family of six (and two dogs). The furnishings in the pool house are a blend of antique pieces and Janus et Cie outdoor furniture, and the landscaping was done by Scapes.

Marbled Magnificence

This cabana is constructed of ivory bricks made from crushed marble, which creates a unique texture with the randomness of cut stone and the depth of masonry stucco. Meanwhile, the interior of the cabana is masonry stucco with travertine floor tiles. A cypress ceiling lends warmth to the space and provides a contrast in color; a large grill and a fireplace flank the seating area and chimneys serve to anchor the front elevation of the structure. The slate roof is complemented by the pool's gunitite coping. Decking for the pool is made from travertine tile while copper-colored glazed porcelain tiles surround the edge of the water and the face of the spa tub.
